ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Broyhill Youth Retreat has a counselor to student ratio of 1:12, fast-paced schedule, and large group activities.

For this reason, we ask that you carefully consider the girls you recommend to BYR.

Below are the requirements all girls must meet.

<p>3. She is able to function at a higher level of independent living.</p>	<p>3. Staff must actively / consistently be involved with helping student "unlearn" inappropriate behaviors.</p>
<p>4. She has few limitations in managing personal health and safety without supervision.</p>	<p>4. She is not capable, at date, to maintain stability without constant staff intervention.</p>
<p>5. She is learning to form trusting relationships with authority figures / peers.</p>	<p>5. She has significant deficits in managing personal health and safety without supervision.</p>
<p>6. She is currently maintaining / developing personal living skills (anger management, communication, peer pressure, proper self-concept) and would benefit from a program to aid in learning such behaviors.</p>	<p>6. She is incapable, at date, to form trusting relationships with authority figures / peers.</p>
<p>7. She demonstrates ability to participate in group discussions / team building exercises.</p>	<p>7. Currently she occasionally or often requires physical restraints of some type. She is currently in need of a staff to be on overnight awake.</p>
<p>8. She is currently at low risk of causing physical harm to property, self, and others due to improper anger management.</p>	<p>8. She has difficulty discussing at any level / demonstrates inability for group cooperation.</p>
<p>9. She is currently at zero to moderate risk for sexual offense/re-offending.</p>	<p>9. She is currently at moderate -- high risk of causing physical harm to property, self, or others due to improper anger management.</p>
<p>10. She has been in LEVEL 1 or 2 care for at least the past 6 months.</p>	<p>10. She is currently at moderate to high risk of sexual re-offending.</p>
<p>11. She has been in your care for at least 6 months.</p>	<p>11. She has been in LEVEL 3 or 4 care (PRTF) sometime within the last 6 months.</p>
<p>12. She will 13 – 19 years old when the retreat begins.</p>	<p>12. She has been in your care for less than 6 months.</p>
	<p>13. She will be outside the ages of 13 – 19 when the retreat begins.</p>
